
Signing Ceremony for Research Collaboration between ZWEEC Analytics and the United States Environment Protection Agency at the Singapore International Water Week 2016

Singapore and the United States share similar goals regarding water quality. In Singapore, one of the goals of PUB, the national water agency encourages Singaporeans to "conserve, value and enjoy" water. In the United States, the Clean Water Act and Safe Drinking Water Act aims to ensure that drinking water is safe and maintain watersheds and their aquatic ecosystems to protect human health, support economic and recreational activities, and provide healthy habitat for fish, plants and wildlife.

Under an MOU between Singapore PUB and the USEPA, this project is a work plan initiative to study and evaluate solutions for the protection of source water. Research will be conducted on response to change in source or ambient water quality and provide indications when a river, lake or reservoir is experiencing conditions that might have a negative impact on ecological health, recreational water quality and drinking water treatment plants.
